1 Introduction

Better EdSpace Ltd is committed to preventing modern slavery and human trafficking in all aspects of our operations and supply chains. We recognise our responsibilities under the **UK Modern Slavery Act 2015** and are dedicated to maintaining transparent and ethical practices.

Although Better EdSpace Ltd operates as an educational institution with a relatively low-risk profile, we remain vigilant and proactive in ensuring that modern slavery or human trafficking are not present in any part of our business.

2 Our Organisation

Better EdSpace Ltd operates a learning centre offering education services for young people. Our activities include:

- Curriculum delivery (GCSE, A-level, and enrichment education)
- Educational technology development
- Camps, workshops, and community-based programmes

We employ qualified educational professionals and maintain robust safeguarding practices for all learners.



3 Our Supply Chains

Our supply chains may include:

- Educational materials and technology suppliers
- IT equipment providers
- Cleaning and facilities services
- Freelance educators and specialist contractors

Suppliers are primarily UK-based; however, we acknowledge that elements of the supply chain (e.g., electronics, printed materials) may originate from higher-risk regions.

4Our Policies

We maintain internal policies that reflect our commitment to ethical and lawful operations, including:

- Code of Conduct for Staff and Contractors

These policies outline expected behaviour, reporting avenues, and consequences for non-compliance.



5 Due Diligence in Supply Chains

Better EdSpace Ltd:

- Conducts proportionate checks on suppliers
- Includes anti-slavery and human trafficking clauses in supplier agreements where feasible
- Follows safer recruitment practices including DBS checks for staff
- Reviews onboarding documentation for contractors to verify right to work

We expect all suppliers to adhere to legal and ethical labour standards.

6 Risk Assessment & Management

We evaluate risk based on:

- Sector and geographical risk factors
- Labour practices of suppliers
- Working conditions for employees, contractors, and agency staff

At present, no specific concerns have been identified. However, we remain committed to mitigation by continual monitoring and periodic review.





7 Training & Awareness

Staff responsible for recruitment, procurement, or safeguarding receive guidance on:

- Recognising signs of modern slavery
- How to raise and escalate concerns
- Our compliance obligations under UK law

We encourage a culture of transparency and protective reporting.

8 Performance Indicators

To ensure ongoing compliance, we track and review:

- Supplier compliance confirmations
- Reports or concerns raised
- Staff training completions
- Policy review cycle

Any concerns or incidents will be fully investigated and corrective actions taken immediately.





9 Commitment to Continuous Improvement

Better EdSpace Ltd is committed to strengthening safeguards and proactive scrutiny of our supply chain. Future actions may include:

- Enhanced supplier auditing
- Further training and awareness campaigns
- Annual legal compliance review
